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What's unique to an IB classroom?

Teachers encouraging student collaboration and inquiry make every classroom a special place for IB. PYP teachers provide learning experiences that allow students to construct deeper meaning of concepts explored in the classroom.

In order to participate in this innovative and effective learning environment, the classroom must first establish essential agreements that all students agree upon. It models the framework for the learning community, displaying the value of student input and feedback as part of the learning process. The essential agreements are constantly addressed and revised when necessary. Each class creates their unique set of essential agreements to allow for efficient planning and collaboration.

What is the Primary Years Program?

The IB Primary Years Program (PYP) is a curriculum framework designed for students 3 to 12 years of age. The curriculum is defined by six transdisciplinary themes of global significance, explored using knowledge and skills derived from six subject areas, with a powerful emphasis on inquiry-based learning.
