01 – PAC Items

 - It was reported that the top 5 will be interviewed next week.

 - It was reported that the top 2 will progress to the Focus Group.
 - Step 5 Focus Group TBD
 - It is expected that the Focus Group will occur the week after Thanksgiving. Comments will be sent to the Superintendent who makes the final decision. The goal is to announce the new principal prior to the end of 2022.
 - Laurel Ridge and Briarlake both finished their processes and the process worked well for them. Neither of the two selectees are on the Fernbank list.

- Note: The principal at DHMS was promoted to Regional Superintendent and they are starting this process as well. Chair is providing support.
- **ACTION**: Chair to seek input on Focus Group questions from PAC.

02 - Principal Report

- COVID Protocols

- CSIP Status
- Ms. Bines-Truitt provided a draft CSIP summary document for PAC review. The
 full document will be uploaded to the web site. The summary will be put on the
 counter of the school and included with the minutes. Literacy and Math are the
 top priorities followed by School Climate.
- Milestones data were reviewed. Progress year over year was noted. Fernbank scored in the upper 25% in DeKalb County. Ms. Bines-Truitt offered to do a deep-dive at a subsequent meeting if desired by the PAC. It was noted that it might be a good idea to pull some samples to see how students are progressing through quartiles over the years. Ms. Bines-Truitt noted this is done in general but not with a specific student (i.e., overall average starting % has increased over time). Progress monitoring was discussed MAP was mentioned, teacher-specific assessments, and other devices are used. Teachers discuss pacing guides and grades regularly. Teachers have robust tools reviewed regularly to know which students need what types of support.

Student Counts

- Ms. Bines-Truitt provided demographic data. The PAC discussed how there is a lack of "other" category in the report.
- Fernbank is at 745 and steadily growing weekly. Enrollment is expected to increase, particularly in upper grades, after winter break. It was noted that DCSD lists Fernabanks as a 950-seat school; Fernbank believes we can successfully handle up to 850 students.
- It was noted that the administrative team has made great strides in balancing class sizes.

03 – Students and Teachers

- Winter MAP Test Schedule
 - It was noted that this will occur in December 2022 and January 2023.
- School Nurse Support
 - **ACTION**: Chair to follow-up with Ms. Bines-Truitt on any actions that occurred.
- Canvas
- It was reported that additional grade levels are adopting Canvas over time. It
 was noted this is an appropriate system for grades 3+. Teachers are learning new
 functionality (e.g., tie to Infinite Campus). Courses continued to be offered to
 teachers.

- It was reported that two PAC members attempted to participate in the Cross-Council meeting but technical difficulties with breakout sessions prevented further participation.

- 1. Fernbank ES will increase the number of 3rd-5th Grade students scoring in the Developing or higher range in ELA on the Georgia Milestones EOG Assessment by 3% (87.61 to 89.00%)
- 2. Fernbank ES will decrease the number of students in grades K-5 scoring in the lowest quartile on the NWEA MAP Assessment from 10.33% to 7.33%

Priority Area II: Mathematics

- 1. Fernbank ES will increase the number of 3rd-5th Grade students scoring in the Developing or higher range in Mathematics on the Georgia Milestones EOG Assessment by 3% (84.00 to 86.52%)
- 2. Fernbank ES will decrease the number of students in grades K-5 scoring in the lowest quartile on the NWEA MAP Assessment from 8.33% to 5.33%


